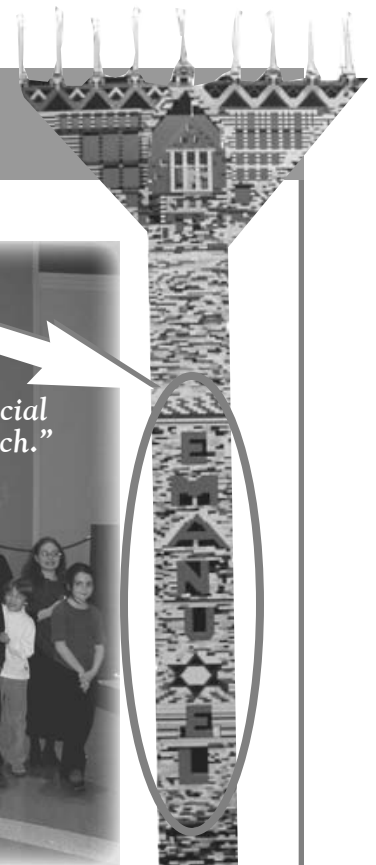
AROUND THE TEMPLE
