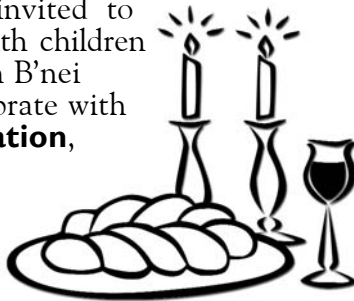

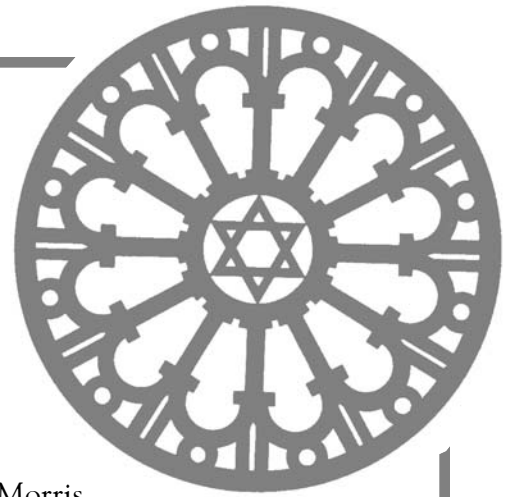


EXHIBIT EXTENDED! WOVEN ABSTRACTIONS
